ABOUT THE PROJECT

Stretches 35 miles between the Mitchell Interchange in Milwaukee, through Racine and Kenosha counties to the Illinois state line

- The \$1.9 billion project will expand the interstate to four lanes in each direction and redesign 17 interchanges
- Construction began in 2009

WIS 20 Interchange Reconstruction Project Update

As part of Wisconsin Department of Transportation's (WisDOT) WIS 20 Interchange reconstruction project, the following upcoming project work and closures are scheduled for the next phase of this project.

Please note that all closures are weather dependent and subject to change.

As part of the I-94 North-South bridge reconstruction over WIS 20, crews will be pouring concrete on the new I-94 EAST (SB) bridge over WIS 20 and will require planned closures.

Tuesday, August 11, 2015:

- WIS 20 Mainline is scheduled to close from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. between the frontage roads.
- I-94 WEST (NB) exit ramp and I-94 EAST (SB) exit ramp to WIS 20 will maintain a right turn only from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Detour:

- → Travelers can utilize County C, 58th Road and the frontage roads as their detour routes to get around the overnight full closures on WIS 20 under 1-94.
- I-94 WEST (NB) entrance ramp from WIS 20 is scheduled to close from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
