WIS 20 Interchange Reconstruction Project Update

As part of Wisconsin Department of Transportation's (WisDOT) WIS 20 Interchange reconstruction project, the following upcoming project work and closures are scheduled for the next phase of this project:

Crews are working to complete concrete paving operations adjacent to the new I-94 EAST (SB) bridge over WIS 20, along with the concrete barrier walls at the new bridge and both will require scheduled closures.

All closures are weather dependent and subject to change.

Upcoming closures the week of August 31:

- WIS 20 under I-94 will be reduced to one lane in each direction between the frontage roads starting Monday, August 31 through Thursday, September 3 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- I-94 EAST (SB) exit ramp to WIS 20 is scheduled to close to traffic Thursday, September 3 from 9:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Detour:

- → Traffic on I-94 EAST (SB) will be directed to exit at County K and use the frontage roads to access WIS 20.
- I-94 WEST (NB) exit ramp to WIS 20 is scheduled to close to traffic Thursday, September 3 from 9:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Detour:

- → Traffic on I-94 WEST (NB) will be directed to exit WIS 11 and utilize the frontage roads to access WIS 20.
- WIS 20 under I-94 is scheduled to close overnight Thursday, September 3 from 9:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Detour:

→ Travelers can utilize the signed detour routes of County C, 58th Road and the frontage roads to get around the overnight full closure on WIS 20 under I-94.
